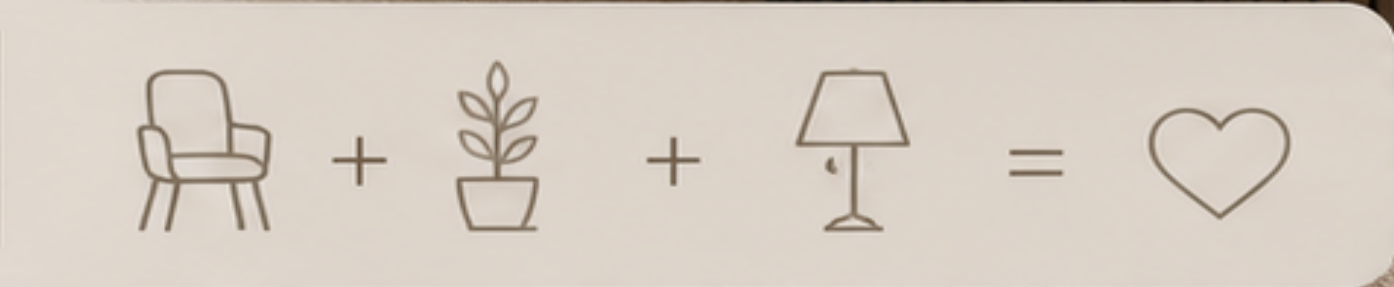

TYPES OF LIGHTING



Natural Lighting

Uses daylight from the sun to illuminate spaces naturally.



Ambient Lighting

Provides overall illumination to create a comfortable and welcoming environment.



Task Lighting

Focused lighting for specific activities like reading, cooking, or working.



Accent Lighting

Highlights architectural features, artwork, or décor to add depth and interest.
